Tips From Theresa Of Road Tech RV

Some antifreeze products for RVs contain alcohol. Alcohol is known to dry out rubber fittings in camper toilets. These products are usually the less expensive antifreeze products on the market. (Laurel Lock uses the pink food-grade antifreeze that does not contain alcohol.) Make sure you purchase the pink, non-alcohol antifreeze when preparing to winterize. Or check with whomever you hire to winterize your trailer to make sure they are using the good stuff.

Laurel Lock Rocks

The fire marshall has set a requirement that all sites at LLC be numbered. Nicolette has been doing a great job of numbering sites that have signed up for rock painting. If you painted your own rock this season and want it judged for the contest, please sign up in the office. At this point, if we see a site that is lacking a number, we are going to supply a numbered rock.

Please leave anti-syphon valves in place when removing your water hose at seasons end. Failure to do so will result in a charge for the installation of a new valve.
