Dock Take Out Dates

All boats, lines and bumpers need to be removed from the **stationary docks** by end of day on **Friday**, **September 15.** All items need to be removed from the **floating docks Sunday**, **September 17.** Any camper that has not removed their boat, lines and bumpers by these deadlines will be charged a relocation fee.

Fiber-Optic Wi-Fi

We have arranged for a representative from Frontier Communications to come to the campground on Saturday, September 16 at 10 a.m. to address questions about the fiber-optic Wi-Fi installation for 2024. This will be the only opportunity to raise questions directly to a Frontier representative. We strongly recommend anyone who is having any questions or concerns about subscribing to the fiber-optic Wi-Fi to attend this meeting. In the interim, we have received the following feedback: a fiber-optic line will be run from a node/utility box into a new modem inside your camper. There will be a category 6 cable running from the modem to the router and your electronic device. Lines will personally password protected. Newer campers may have a cable connection compatible with the fiber-optic line. If your RV does not, Frontier will pull out the old cable connection and install a new fiber-optic compatible connection. The primary installation date is scheduled to be May 4, 2024. You will need to be present for the installation or make sure management has a key to access your RV. Current Frontier customers making the change to fiber-optic will need to cancel their service at the end of this season. Copper Wi-Fi service currently in operation at the campground will be discontinued in 2024 as it has deteriorated and requires an excessive amount of service calls.

Can you recharge your AC? There have been some RV owners who have had a tap installed on the copper tubing so the refrigerant can be "recharged." However, what can happen is either damage to the AC unit or injury to the owner as a result of weld not holding, or the pressure does not hold for very long to keep the unit cooling properly. It's really not worth the risk or the expense.
