April Payments

April campsite payments were due by April 1st and are delinquent as of May 1. We will accept April payments without late fees if received in our office by Sunday, May 9.

Boat, Dock & Cart Payments

Boat, dock and golf cart payments are due in our office by May 15th. There is no grace period on these payments so make sure your payment is received in our office by the 15th to avoid a late fee. Dock slip holders who don't pay slip fees will not have their slips held for them.

Camp Store Offerings

Initially our camp store will be selling ice, firewood and fire starters, propane, and landscaping stones only. We hope to reopen the store in full capacity in June.

Anti-Syphon Valves

Each campsite water spigot has had an anti-syphon valve placed on it prior to this camping season. These valves protect our water system from becoming contaminated by bacteria in hoses or RVs. Under no circumstances are campers allowed to remove the antisyphon valves from the spigot. There will be a \$100 fee assessed to any camper whose water spigot has had the anti-syphon valve removed.

RV Water System Cleanout

Each RV water system needs to be disinfected prior to hooking up to a drinking-water quality hose to your site's water spigot. Refer to your RV manual for specific disinfecting instructions. Your drinking water hose should be replaced periodically.

Construction Noise and Notes

All construction must be pre-approved through Tom Hornat (860-965-1453) and subject to any necessary permits. Shed placement also needs to be approved. Noise from construction is not allowed during the weekends beginning May 28, so please plan accordingly prior to beginning work. Please call Tom with any questions.

Grubs and Grass Seed

In an effort to get back grass eaten by grubs in the Safari field and ball field we have planted grass seed in the bare spots of those two fields. Please help to our efforts by keeping off the bare areas until grass has been established.

Did You Know?

Hollow cement blocks are only structurally sound with their holes facing upwards. Please consider resupporting your trailers and decks if you have the hollows of blocks parallel to the ground.
