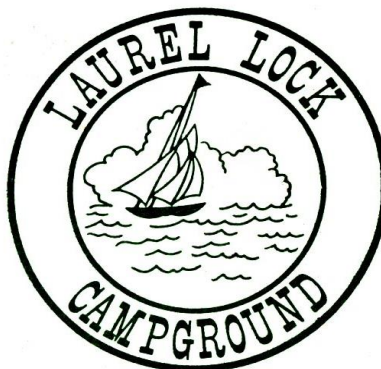
Mosquito Deterrents

With all the rain we have had in the past few weeks, the mosquitos are out there looking for a good bite. Mostly daybreak and sunset are when most of the mosquito action occurs. Burning coffee grounds is a good deterrent for keeping mosquitos away from your campsite. Additionally, make sure your site isn’t harboring catch basins of water where these insects lay their eggs. Our camp store carries an essential oil repellent called Nantucket Spider for personal use. No harmful ingredients - and it smells great.

The Stop Sign

Please always come to a full and complete stop at the stop sign when entering camp, no exceptions. Whether you’re driving your car or cart, we expect each vehicle to stop even if our staff sees you ahead of the sign and waves you on, and even if the office is not open. This allows drivers heading to this very congested area of camp from all directions to take stock of the roadway before they proceed. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter. Also, please know our staff can not see your hang tag if you have tinted windows. Please open your passenger window so staff can see your tag if that is the case.

Your Seasonal Campsite Agreement

Each of our seasonal campers has signed a seasonal campsite agreement. Therefore, we expect campers to adhere to the rules and policies stated in the agreement. We assume you have read the agreement before signing. We send campers 2 copies of the agreement in January so you have a copy to refer to when questions arise. Also, our agreements are on our website. Please review your agreement during this early part of the season so you know you are in adherence to our rules.

Wood Pallets Not Allowed

Please do not bring wooden pallets to camp for any reason. Pallets often harbor insects which can create havoc to our environment.

Golf Cart Seating
