Boat Storage At Laurel Lock

If you are storing your boat at LLC for the winter season, please be sure to **park your trailer on the eastern side of the field (the side closest to Cottage Road) and park it in a recently mowed spot in line with other trailers.** Stored boats need to be prepaid and registered in the office by October 9.
