New Recycling Procedures

Our recycling center has changed. Please note: All cardboard is to be flattened and placed in the far-right dumpster at the trash area by the rec hall. All other recyclable items are to be loosely placed (not in plastic bags) in the 90-gallon bins to the right of the cardboard dumpster. Due to a lack of following guidelines in the past, surveillance cameras have been installed on the dumpster area. The 30-yard dumpster has been filled and removed. All bulky waste must be taken home or to the dump.

WiFi

Rob Moore of Frontier is being an advocate on LLC's behalf within Frontier to get the copper internet service lines from 2023 placed back in service for 2024 for those sites/lot numbers that had service in 2023. Rob has a list of the site/lot numbers. Only last year's customers should reach out to him. Rob's number is 860-303-0143. This is a time-sensitive issue and you should reach out to Rob ASAP.

Anti-Syphon Valves

Each campsites' water spigot has had an anti-syphon valve placed on it prior to this camping season. These valves protect our water system from becoming contaminated by bacteria in hoses or RVs. Under no circumstances are campers allowed to remove anti-syphon valves from the spigots. There will be a \$200 fee assessed to any camper whose water spigot has had the anti-syphon valve removed.

RV Water System Cleanout

Each RV water system needs to be disinfected prior to hooking up a hose to your site's water spigot. Refer to your RV manual for specific disinfecting instructions. Use only white drinking-water quality hoses. Your drinking-water hose should be replaced periodically.
