

Update as of April 9, 2020

Dear Laurel Lock Campers,

The Connecticut Campground Owners Association, CCOA, has been working hard on our behalf and today posted new information about the status of campgrounds in Connecticut. Please read the update below. A couple notes from us: You are permitted to come onto camp property to clean your site and RV at this time, however, you must bring your own water to clean with. If you have water running to your site, we ask that you NOT use it as we are opening up the system and need to access water usage to see if we have any leaks. Our bathrooms and store will continue to be closed at this time. Please do not bring visitors onto the property even if you intend to use them for work detail. Most importantly, continue to practice social distancing.

We hope everyone is safe and well during this difficult time.

Hello,

We have received notification from the state that we will be allowed to open for seasonals (de facto 2nd home) and essential workers. Transients, weekenders and recreationalists are still prohibited similar to our surrounding states. We will continue to work on getting that prohibition lifted as well. At this point, that restriction is in place until at least April 30th.

All other restrictions and Executive orders are still in place. All campgrounds must continue to adhere to previous Executive Orders and keep all public areas/activities (Rec Halls, event spaces, restaurants, sports fields etc.) closed and enforce the no more than 5 people together at the same time in your public areas. If you are capable of doing it, we also recommend any contact with the office be remote if at all possible and limit access to your store. You must continue an ongoing, aggressive cleaning and sterilization program.

We appreciate all of your support and patience during this difficult time. We will continue to work hard on behalf of all our members with the hopes of having a very positive and successful 2020 season.
