#### **Sign Up Lists**

Lists for fall and spring site cleanup, winterization of RV water systems and boat storage are available this weekend at the office. Please know that you must sign up for these services each year. We can not assume if you had those services last year you will repeat them again this year.

#### Revised **Dock Take-Out Schedule**

The dock take-out schedule has been pushed back for a variety of reasons. Laurel Lock's stationary docks are scheduled for take out the week of September 18 and the floating docks are scheduled to come out the **week of** September 25. All dock patrons are required to remove their boats, lines and bumpers by Sunday, September 18 and September 25 respectively. All lines and bumpers not removed will be considered abandoned. Boats not winter storing at camp need to be removed from the property by closed of camp on October 10.

#### **Boat Storage**

If you intend to store a boat trailer or any trailer in the boat field at camp this winter, please register and pay in the camp office before October 10. A fee of \$200 is due upon sign up. Please make sure you have a Laurel Lock number sticker attached to your trailer's tongue. New this year: Boats stored after 10/10/22 but not registered in the office and paid for prior to the close of camp will be charged an additional fee of \$50. Please note: Outside vendors who come onto camp property to service or shrink wrap boats must provide the office with a liability certificate with Laurel Lock Campground named on the paperwork.
